Town Hall, Sint-Oedenrode

The Town Hall of Sint-Oedenrode is currently located in the former castle Dommelrode which was occupied by the sheriff of Peelland from 1605 to 1645. The buildings have undergone significant conversion, but the historic appearance has remained intact. The green areas surrounding the former Castle/Town Hall have been thoroughly updated. The forecourt has been given a formal status with tightly patterned groups of shrubs and trees, for which Van den Berk supplied the *Gleditsia triacanthos* and *Alnus spaethii* in size 25-30-35 cm. Large water features and winding paths have been created in the park at the rear. There is also a sizeable red chestnut tree (*Aesculus carnea*), which had to be moved to a different location due to the expansion of the town hall. With a remarkable feat of expertise, Van de Berk Nurseries transplanted this tree, which weighed more than 32 tons at the time.
