

# Planting instructions

## Series 1 Planting instructions with anchoring



The planting hole must, depending on the circumstances, be large in relation to the rootball. Loosen/break up the earth at the bottom of the hole.



Fill the remainder of the planting hole and stamp down.



Carry the tree by the rootball (or trunk).



Continue to fill the plant hole and level the soil.



Allow the tree to rest against an object in order to prevent damage to the branches. Wrap jute around the trunk to protect the bark, and then pull the sling around it.



Make two holes next to the rootball for the tree poles.



Place the tree in the sling vertically in the planting hole. Only use the sling when the flow of sap has stopped.



Push the tree poles down firmly.



The top of the rootball must be at (or a little higher than) ground level. The rootball must **NEVER** be placed too deep. **ATTENTION:** The gauze and jute may **NOT** be removed from a rootball.



Tie the tree to the tops of poles with tree straps.



Fill the planting hole 1/3 full with soil.



Overall picture.



Stamp the soil in the planting hole down firmly.
