



## Fraxinus excelsior 'Atlas'



<b>Height</b>	20-25 m
<b>Width</b>	8-12m
<b>Crown</b>	narrow conical, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown, grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green, feathered leaf
<b>Flowers</b>	yellowgreen, flowers in April
<b>Fruits</b>	fruitless cultivar
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
<b>Soil moisture</b>	suitable for wet soil, withstand short flood
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates partial paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	good
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, resistant to de-icing salt
<b>Application</b>	avenues and broad streets, coastal areas, industrial areas
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

Fraxinus excelsior 'Atlas' is a relatively late-sprouting cultivar which can be recognized by its slender habit. It has a pyramidal to conical crown and attains a height of 20 - 25 m. The shiny dark green leaf is odd-pinnate and has a yellow autumn colour. After the inconspicuous male inflorescence there are no fruits. Useful as an avenue and street tree. 'Atlas' prefers rich, moist soil. Wind resistant. Winter hardiness zone: 4
