



# Fraxinus excelsior 'Aurea Pendula'



<b>Height</b>	5-8 m
<b>Width</b>	5-6m
<b>Crown</b>	broad weeping, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown, grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green, yellow, feathered leaf
<b>Autumn colour</b>	yellow
<b>Flowers</b>	none
<b>Fruits</b>	fruitless cultivar
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
<b>Soil moisture</b>	suitable for wet soil, withstand short flood
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates partial paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	fairly
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), resistant to de-icing salt
<b>Application</b>	coastal areas, industrial areas, small gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree

Fraxinus excelsior 'Aurea Pendula' is a relatively slow-growing tree with strikingly yellow twigs. The branches are strongly pendulous giving it a nice weeping look. It can attain a height of 5 - 8 m. The compound leaf is light green in summer and has a yellow autumn colour. 'Aurea Pendula' does not bear flowers and fruits and is used as a solitary and a park tree and in gardens. The tree prefers rich, moist soil. Winter hardiness zone: 4
