## Fraxinus excelsior 'Geessink'



| Height                | 15-20 m   |
|-----------------------|---|
| Width                 | 10-15m  |
| Crown                 | broad ovoid, half-open crown  |
| Bark and branches     | brown, grey   |
| Leaf                  | green, feathered leaf   |
| Flowers               | yellowgreen, flowers in April   |
| Fruits                | little  |
| Spines/thorns         | None  |
| Toxicity              | usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock                       |
| Soil type             | clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil                          |
| Soil moisture         | suitable for wet soil, withstand short flood                                  |

| Winter hardiness zone | 4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)   |

Fraxinus excelsior 'Geessink' is a fairly tall tree with a good, slightly bending, upright going trunk. Height 15 - 20 m. At first the crown is narrow pyramidal, later wide ovoid to almost round. The compound, odd-pinnate leaf has 9 - 11 leaflets, is mat dark green and light green underneath. In autumn the leaf turns yellow. After the inflorescence it bears only a few fruits. Applicable in road and street planting. 'Geessink' prefers nutritive, moist soil. Winter hardiness zone: 4
