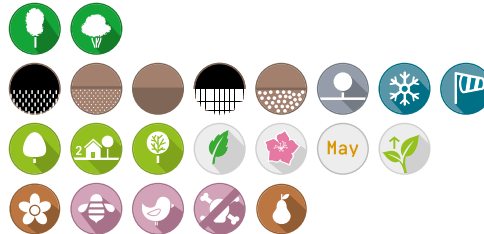




## Malus 'Hillieri'



<b>Height</b>	5-7 m
<b>Width</b>	4-6m
<b>Crown</b>	broad ovoid, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Flowers</b>	pink, flowers in May
<b>Fruits</b>	yellow, red
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, acid soil, calcareous soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	good, susceptible to sea wind
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
<b>Fauna tree</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, provides food for birds
<b>Application</b>	roof gardens, industrial areas, small gardens, patio gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

Malus 'Hillieri' has a broad ovoid crown with somewhat pendulous branches: it grows to a height of 5 - 7 m. The oval leaves are green. Red flower buds appears fairly late on, in the second half of May. The flowers are pink and single, approx. 3 cm in diameter. 'Hillieri' produces red to yellow round fruit. It can be used in parks, public gardens and small gardens and makes heavy demands on the soil as regards moisture supply and fertility. The tree is sensitive to scab and to sea wind. Winter hardiness zone: 4
