



Malus toringo 'Brouwers Beauty'


Height

5 - 6 m

Width

4-6m

Crown

broad fan-shaped, half-open crown, capricious growing

Bark and branches

grey-brown, smooth

Leaf

oval, green

Flowers

light pink, buds purplish pink, about 2.5 - 3 cm, April/late May, fragrant flowers

Fruits

yellow with orange-red blush, Ø about 1 cm

Spines/thorns

None

Toxicity

usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock

Soil type

fertile, well drained soil

Paving

tolerates paving

Winter hardness zone

5a (-28,8 to -26,1 °C)

Wind resistance

good, susceptible to sea wind

Other resistances

resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind

Fauna tree

resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, provides food for birds

Application

narrow streets, tree containers, roof gardens, industrial areas, small gardens, patio gardens

Shape

clearstem tree, multi-stem tree

Malus toringo 'Brouwers Beauty' is a tree that grows vertically and has a strong main stem. It eventually assumes a broad fan shape with somewhat overhanging branches. Height and width 5 - 6 m. The oval green leaves have a sharply serrated edge. It produces abundant pale pink flowers. The flowers are single, the flower buds purple-pink. Yellow to orange-yellow fruits, Ø approx. 1 cm, appear in the late summer and remain on the tree until the end of October. For parks, wide streets, green verges and small gardens. Slightly sensitive to scab. Winter hardness zone: 5a
