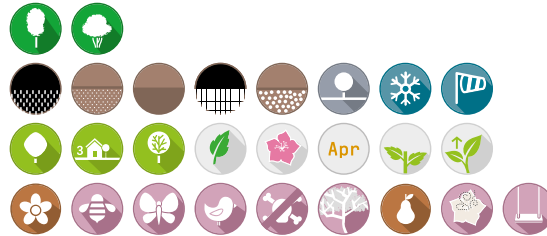




## Malus toringo 'Brouwers Beauty'



<b>Height</b>	5 - 6 m
<b>Width</b>	4-6m
<b>Crown</b>	broad fan-shaped, half-open crown, capricious growing
<b>Bark and branches</b>	grey-brown, smooth
<b>Leaf</b>	oval, green
<b>Flowers</b>	light pink, buds purplish pink, about 2.5 - 3 cm, April/late May, fragrant flowers
<b>Fruits</b>	yellow with orange-red blush, Ø about 1 cm
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	fertile, well drained soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	5a (-28,8 to -26,1 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	good, susceptible to sea wind
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
<b>Fauna tree</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, provides food for birds
<b>Application</b>	narrow streets, tree containers, roof gardens, industrial areas, small gardens, patio gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem
<b>Origin</b>	NAKB, Zeewolde, Netherlands, 1996

Malus toringo 'Brouwers Beauty' is a tree that grows vertically and has a strong main stem. It eventually assumes a broad fan shape with somewhat overhanging branches. Height and width 5 - 6 m. The oval green leaves have a sharply serrated edge. It produces abundant pale pink flowers. The flowers are single, the flower buds purple-pink. Yellow to orange-yellow fruits, Ø approx. 1 cm, appear in the late summer and remain on the tree until the end of October. For parks, wide streets, green verges and small gardens. Slightly sensitive to scab. Winter hardiness zone: 5a
