



## Populus x canadensis 'Hees'



<b>Height</b>	20-25 m, fast growing
<b>Width</b>	15-20m
<b>Crown</b>	broad ovoid, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown, grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Flowers</b>	green, flowers in April
<b>Fruits</b>	greenbrown
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	good
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
<b>Application</b>	avenues and broad streets, coastal areas
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree

Populus x canadensis 'Hees' This female cultivar has a more or less straight trunk with long, upward-pointing branches. The tree has a broad ovoid crown whose branches later bend downwards. The young leaves emerge fairly late and are light green in colour. The tree produces flowers in the form of female catkins. 'Hees' is very resistant to rust and canker and resistant to leaf spot disease. It is resistant to wind, even in coastal regions. Winter hardiness zone: 4
