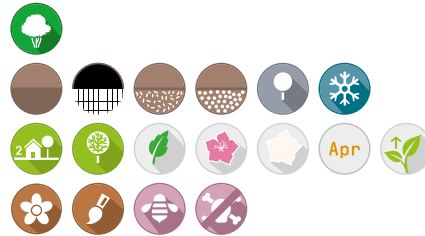




## Prunus incisa 'Lotte'

| <b>Toxicity</b>              | usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock         |
| <b>Soil type</b>             | clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, all soil types |
| <b>Paving</b>                | tolerates no paving                                             |
| <b>Winter hardiness zone</b> | 6b (-20,5 to -17,8 °C)                                          |
| <b>Wind resistance</b>       | moderate                                                        |
| <b>Other resistances</b>     | resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)                                   |
| <b>Fauna tree</b>            | resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), valuable for bees (honey plant)  |
| <b>Application</b>           | small gardens, patio gardens                                    |
| <b>Shape</b>                 | multi-stem treem                                                |

Small, densely branched tree with an irregular manner of growth, mostly with a fan-shaped to rounded crown. Height 6 - 8 m. The thin twigs droop and are grey-brown. The oval to obovate/ovoid leaves taper to a point and measure 3 - 6 cm. The leaf edge is double serrated. The leaves take on a yellow to orange colour in the autumn. Produces many small single white flowers with a pink calyx. Prunus incisa flowers very early, often as early as March or at the beginning of April. The flowers are followed by small purplish-black fruits. For parks, gardens and open verges. It prefers nutritious and humid soil. Winter hardiness zone: 6b
