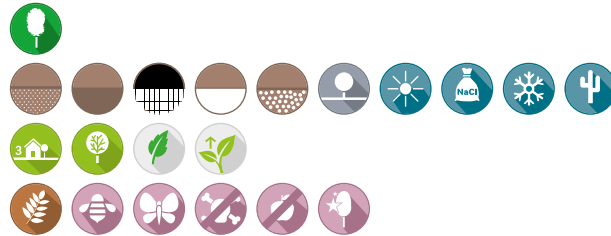




## Robinia pseudoacacia 'Myrtifolia'



<b>Height</b>	3-4 m
<b>Width</b>	2-3m
<b>Crown</b>	round/spherical, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown, grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green, feathered leaf
<b>Flowers</b>	seldom
<b>Fruits</b>	fruitless cultivar
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, nutrient-poor soil, calcareous soil
<b>Soil moisture</b>	suitable for dry soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	5a (-28,8 to -26,1 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	fairly
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), resistant to de-icing salt
<b>Fauna tree</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), resistant to de-icing salt, valuable for butterflies
<b>Application</b>	industrial areas, small gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree

Robinia pseudoacacia 'Myrtifolia' is a small-leaved cultivar with a loose, vertical manner of growth. When the tree is older the branches grow horizontally, ultimately forming a spherical crown. The height depends on the grafting position, usually approx. 3 - 4 m. The imparipinnate leaves have 9 to 19 bright green leaf segments. These are broadly ovoid to ovoid and attain a size of 1 - 1.5 cm. The slightly incised top of the leaves is striking. Leafs out late and keeps its leaves long into the autumn. Rarely blooms. Winter hardiness zone: 5a
