



Acer campestre 'Huibers Elegant'



Height	6-12 m
Width	3-4m
Crown	ovoid / egg-shaped, dark, dense crown
Bark and branches	brown, grey
Leaf	green
Autumn colour	yellow
Flowers	yellowgreen, flowers in April
Fruits	greenbrown
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, all soil types
Paving	tolerates paving
Winter hardiness zone	5a (-28,8 to -26,1 °C)
Wind resistance	good/very good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, resistant to de-icing salt
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, resistant to de-icing salt, valuable for butterflies
Application	avenues and broad streets, narrow streets, tree containers, roof gardens, coastal areas, industrial areas
Shape	clearstem tree

Small to medium size tree, initially narrow pyramidal, later ovoid. The branching pattern is conspicuously steep, around 45°. This means the crown stays fairly narrow. The dark green leaf turns a deep golden yellow in autumn. The leaf is highly resistant to mildew, red spider mite and gall mite. A good avenue tree for use on green belts, road verges, narrower streets, housing estates and squares. Unlike other *Acer campestre* cultivars, it grows fairly well enclosed by paved surfaces.
