



## Fagus sylvatica 'Laciniata'



<b>Height</b>	20-25 m
<b>Width</b>	18-20m
<b>Crown</b>	round/spherical, dark, dense crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Autumn colour</b>	yellow
<b>Flowers</b>	yellowgreen, flowers in May
<b>Fruits</b>	brown
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, calcareous soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates no paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	5b (-26,0 to -23,4 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	moderate
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
<b>Application</b>	avenues and broad streets
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, feathered tree
<b>Synonyms</b>	Fagus sylvatica heterophylla

Fagus sylvatica 'Laciniata' (syn. F. s. heterophylla) has a spreading, round crown and attains a height of 20 - 25 m. The green leaf is irregularly pinnately dissected and has a yellow to red-brown autumn colour. It is less deeply dissected than 'Asplenifolia', but deeper dissected than 'Grandidentata'. The tree has an inflorescence with small, inconspicuous flower catkins. These are followed by nutlets. 'Laciniata' is a specimen tree. It prefers a well-drained soil that is not too wet and is rich in humus content. Moderately wind resistant. Winter hardiness zone: 5b
