



## Fraxinus pennsylvanica 'Patmore'



<b>Height</b>	15-18 m
<b>Width</b>	10-12m
<b>Crown</b>	broad ovoid, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown, grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green, feathered leaf
<b>Autumn colour</b>	yellow
<b>Flowers</b>	yellowgreen, flowers in April, May
<b>Fruits</b>	fruitless cultivar
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
<b>Soil moisture</b>	suitable for dry soil, suitable for wet soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	good
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, resistant to de-icing salt
<b>Application</b>	avenues and broad streets, coastal areas
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree

Fraxinus pennsylvanica 'Patmore' is a very hardy, male selection. The tree was found near Edmonton, Alberta, Canada and has a spreading, ovoid and symmetrical crown. Mature trees can attain a height of 15 - 18 m. The straight trunk is brown grey. The leaf is shiny dark green and persists long in autumn. 'Patmore' has a yellow autumn colour. After the flowering there is no seed production. Suitable as an avenue tree for wide road profiles. Prefers well-drained soil and tolerates drought. Winter hardiness zone: 3
