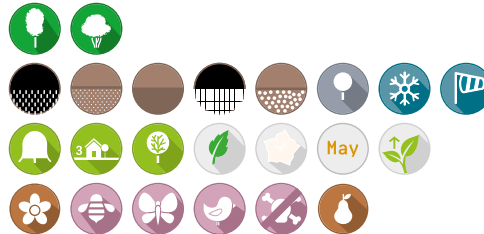




## Malus 'Butterball'



<b>Height</b>	4-5 m
<b>Width</b>	4-5m
<b>Crown</b>	broad weeping, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Flowers</b>	white , flowers in May
<b>Fruits</b>	yellow
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, acid soil, calcareous soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates no paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	5 (-28,8 to -23,4 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	good, susceptible to sea wind
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
<b>Fauna tree</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, provides food for birds
<b>Application</b>	industrial areas, small gardens, patio gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

An ornamental apple tree with a broad, horizontal, later pendulous manner of growth and a height of 4 - 5 m. The leaves are broad, covered with felt-like hair and light green in colour. In early May white flowers appear that are remarkably pink when in bud. The flowers are single. The short-stemmed fruits are glossy golden yellow and have a diameter of 2 - 3 cm. They remain only a short time on the tree. 'Butterball' is used in gardens and parks and makes heavy demands on the soil as regards moisture supply and fertility. 'Butterball' is resistant to mildew but sensitive to scab. The tree is sensitive to sea wind. Winter hardiness zone: 5
