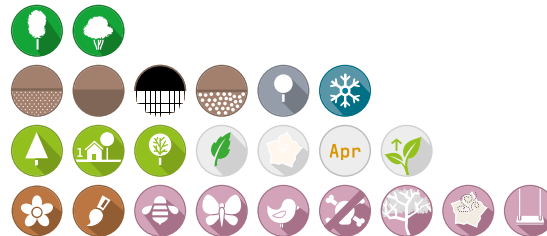




Prunus avium 'Landscape Bloom'



Height	15 - 20 m
Width	10-15m
Crown	pyramidal, half-open crown, capricious growing
Bark and branches	twigs reddish brown to grey, bark glossy brown-red, smooth
Leaf	ovate to elongated, bright green, 6 - 15 cm, autumn colour yellowish red
Autumn colour	yellow, orange, red
Flowers	pure white, about 2.5 cm, April, fragrant flowers
Fruits	round, dark red, about 1 cm, not numerous
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	limy, fertile, sandy soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
Wind resistance	fairly
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), provides food for birds
Application	avenues and broad streets, industrial areas
Shape	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

This is a Dutch selection from *Prunus avium* that grows 'more tightly' than the species. The tree has a narrow pyramidal crown that becomes broader at a later stage. Its eventual height is 15 - 20 m. The glossy bark is brownish-red. The large ovoid leaves are dark green and grow to 15 cm in size. The leaf edge is irregularly serrated and the leaves have a yellow-orange to scarlet colour in the autumn. Its flowers appear in April in bundles of white semi-double flowers. These give way to small dark red fruits that are not edible. 'Landscape Bloom' is used as a park and landscape tree. It prefers nutritious and humid soil. Winter hardiness zone: 4
