



## Prunus padus 'Colorata'



<b>Height</b>	6-8 m
<b>Width</b>	6-7m
<b>Crown</b>	round/spherical, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown, grey
<b>Leaf</b>	reddisch brown, redbrown
<b>Flowers</b>	pink, flowers in April
<b>Fruits</b>	red, black
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates no paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	3 (-40,0 to -24,5 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	moderate
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
<b>Fauna tree</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), provides food for birds
<b>Application</b>	small gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

Prunus padus 'Colorata' forms a sturdy bush to small tree with a half-open rounded crown. Height 6 - 8 m. A noticeable difference with the species is that 'Colorata' produces leaves that emerge reddish-brown. In the summer the leaves are dark green with purple veins. The underside of the leaf is purplish. The flowers are light pink and in bunches. Flowers in late April. Reddish-black fruit (drupes) appear in late summer. Used as a park tree and sometimes as forage for bees. It stands up to wet soil. Winter hardiness zone: 3
