



Prunus pensylvanica 'Auburn Splendor'

Prunus pensylvanica 'Auburn Splendor' has a spreading flattened spherical crown. Height approx. 8 m. The bark is chestnut brown. The long narrow leaves are bright green and grow to 6 - 11 cm in size. In the autumn they turn yellow and red. The tree blooms at the end of April at the same time as the leaves emerge. The bright white flowers grow in bunches of 3 - 5 together and have a diameter of approx. 1.5 cm. They are followed by bright red round fruit, Ø approx. 0.6 cm. Winter hardiness zone: 3
