



Quercus ×hispanica 'Ambrozyana'



Height	5-6 m
Width	5-6m
Crown	round/spherical, half-open crown
Bark and branches	grey
Leaf	evergreen
Flowers	light yellow, flowers in May
Fruits	brown, little
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
Soil moisture	suitable for wet soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	7a (-17,7 to -15,0 °C)

Small tree with round crown, to about 6 m. This tree was also described as a cultivar of *Q. cerris* because of the much closer similarity between the leaves. The glossy, dark green leaves are 7 to 9 cm long with a thin point on each lobe. Depending on the climate of the site, the leaves are evergreen to semi-evergreen. During severe cold, the leaves turn brown in the winter, only falling when the new leaves emerge. A healthy, warmth-loving tree which prefers a limy soil. Its Central-European origin means it tolerates our winters better than other *Quercus hispanica* cultivars.
