

Cryptomeria japonica 'Kitayama'



| Height | 4-7 m |
|-----------------------|---|
| Width | 3-4m |
| Crown | narrow upright, open crown |
| Bark and branches | flaking, reddisch brown |
| Leaf | green, evergreen |
| Flowers | inconspicuous, flowers in April |
| Spines/thorns | None |
| Toxicity | usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock |
| Soil type | loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, acid soil |
| Paving | tolerates no paving |
| Winter hardiness zone | 6a (-23,3 to -20,6 °C) |
| Wind resistance | moderate |
| Other resistances | resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6) |
| Application | small gardens, patio gardens |
| Shape | clearstem tree, specimen conifer |

Cryptomeria japonica 'Kitayama' is a good growing, rather slender upright small tree to a height of 4 - 7 m. It forms a continuous central branch and initially has a somewhat loose, open structure, but as the tree ages, the branching also becomes denser. The foliage is light green to medium green and remains a beautiful green even in winter. This somewhat lesser-known cultivar has been in Europe since 1979, having been imported from Japan by the Boskoop Nursery Research Station. Hardiness zone: 6a
